9/11 Memorial

Plans are currently under way for the design and construction of a 9/11 Memorial that will be located at the Crescent Springs Community Park. The memorial will be in close proximity to the existing War Memorial at the corner of Buttermilk and Collins Road. Conceptually, the memorial will include renderings of the twin towers that once graced the New York skyline. In the shape of a pentagon at the base, the memorial will pay tribute to five groups deeply effected on that historic day which includes Firefighters, the Police, the airline industry, the civilians who worked and lived in the buildings effected, and the Pentagon. The memorial will include a time line of the actual events and will also include subtle images and tributes to each of the groups. The centerpiece of the memorial is an I-Beam that was secured from Ground Zero. A committee comprised of residents, public service, the police department, the fire department, the airline industry, city council and mayors totals eleven members. The group has been working for the past several months to turn the memorial into a reality by 9/11/2011, the ten year anniversary of the event that forever changed the United States. Funding for the memorial will be primarily through private contributions. 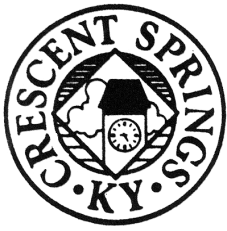

SUMMERTIME FUN AND SAFETY

School's out and vacation time is near. But, what do you need to do to stay safe and have fun?

First of all, be more vigilant when driving through our neighborhoods. Children are outside more and may dart out into traffic on foot or on a bicycle. Slow down when driving through highly populated areas and especially near parks and ball fields.

Secondly, if going out of town, even for a day or two, prepare your home so that it doesn't appear that you are gone. Leave on lights that you would normally have on in the evening. Keep shades and/or blinds in their normal positions. Stop mail and paper delivery. Arrange to have grass mowed while you are away. Leave a car in the driveway or ask a neighbor to park in your driveway. You may even want to leave a radio on so that it sounds as if someone is inside the house. As you leave, be sure to close and lock all doors and windows securely. Remember that you can also call the Erlanger Police Department at 727-7599 to put your house on a watch list while you are away.

Finally, while traveling, be vigilant about personal safety and securing your personal property. Clean out your purse or wallet and take only essential credit cards. Plan to use credit cards or travelers checks instead of carrying a large amount of cash. Carry your purse close to your body and consider carrying your wallet in a front pants pocket. While visiting an unfamiliar area be sure to travel only in well-lighted, well-traveled streets. Check maps ahead of time so that you are not distracted which can
